

# LEADERSHIP PIPELINE





## We cultivate the leaders of tomorrow.

Our leadership development programs ensure we have leaders for the APA community by offering opportunities for them to develop the knowledge, access, and network to support their rise to the top of the civic and political arena.



The CAUSE Leadership Academy (CLA), is a nine-week paid summer internship program for students interested in politics, public policy, and/or Asian Pacific Americans (APA) community issues. Through exposure to decision-makers, policy makers, and the issues of the day, students gain a deeper awareness of the political issues facing the APA community in California.

## **QUARTERLY MEETINGS**



# CIVIC ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS

We empower and educate our communities. In order for our APA communities to be aware, mobilize, and vote in future political debates, our **Voter Outreach, Training, and Education (VOTE) Initiatives** provide culturally-aware outreach resources to encourage civic participation. We understand that our communities need to have the knowledge, access, and network to be fully immersed in our democracy.

Our programs inspire APAs of all ages to voice their vote and define their future.







## THE NEED

There are 3.7 million eligible APA voters in California, but only 2.3 million are registered. We're empowering our community to get registered and voice their vote.



With over 40 languages spoken under the APA umbrella, the need for catered outreach and engagement is of utmost importance.



According to APIA Vote...

80% of registered APA voters in California received no contact about the 2012 elections



More needs to be done to engage voters for the 2018 elections.

## **VOTER OUTREACH**

Through Voter Outreach efforts, CAUSE works hard to register voters and get them to pledge to vote. Our approach to voter registration and turnout is vast and varied:

Curated resources are readily available on our website to educate the APA community on the voter registration process.

Once individuals have pledged to vote with us, we're ensuring they have the tools and resources they need to make an informed and educated vote.

Our person-to-person approach to connecting with voters provides our community with the access to all of the information they need to fully participate in the decision making process.



## **TRAINING & EDUCATION**

CAUSE Voter Training & Education efforts provides voters with valuable access to voter education and registration workshops, candidate debates and forums, and community issue town halls.

All of our voter training and education programs include segments on registering to vote, how to vote/read a ballot, and how voters can find their polling place or register as a permanent vote by mail voter.
