Forest hosts Career Fair to recruit wildland fire and non-fire positions

ARCADIA, Calif. — A career fair will be held Jan. 6, from 11 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. at the Forest Headquarters in Arcadia (701 N. Santa Anita Ave., Arcadia, CA 91006). This career fair aims to expose prospective applicants to career opportunities in the Forest Service. Furthermore, it will help applicants understand the duties and requirements for seasonal wildland firefighting and other non-fire positions.

To apply for a seasonal GS-3-GS-5 wildland fire position: Applicants must apply at www.usajobs.gov between Jan. 10-15 to be considered eligible. Additionally, they must pass a work capacity test consisting of completion of a three-mile hike within 45 minutes while carrying a 45 pound pack. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older, have U.S. Citizenship and be a high school or GED graduate. Males born after Dec. 31, 1959, must be registered with the Selective Service. Proficiency in English is beneficial, but not required. Other requirements can be found in the vacancy announcements on www.usajobs.gov.

The mission of the U.S. Forest Service, part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, is to sustain the health, diversity and productivity of the nation's forests and grasslands to meet the needs of present and future generations. The agency manages 193 million acres of public land, provides assistance to state and private landowners, and maintains the largest forestry research organization in the world. Public lands the Forest Service manages contribute more than \$13 billion to the economy each year through visitor spending alone. Those same lands provide 20 percent of the nation's clean water supply, a value estimated at \$7.2 billion per year. The agency has either a direct or indirect role in stewardship of about 80 percent of the 850 million forested acres within the U.S., of which 100 million acres are urban forests where most Americans live.
