

Job Title: Case Worker/Youth Service Specialist

Basic Function:

Assist in the implementation of direct educational and social services appropriate for high-risk, at-risk, probation, foster care and/or low-income youth and their families in order to help youth reduce their criminal involvement and recidivism and overcome barriers to success in their family, school, community, employment and life. Programs include but are not limited to: Gang Intervention Services, Gender Specific Services in the Community, Home Based Services to High-Risk High-Needs Youth and Families, Educational Pathways & Vocational Opportunities Services and Workforce Investment Act Youth Program serving Out-Of-School Youth. Some of the areas we serve include, but are not limited to: Inglewood, Crenshaw, Compton, East LA, San Gabriel Valley and Antelope Valley.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Facilitate social learning models instruction individually or in groups;
- 2. Facilitate youth development activities, mentoring activities and fieldtrips;
- 3. Facilitate individual assessment and planning;
- 4. Implement individual service plans;
- 5. Facilitate individual and group parent education;
- 6. Assist in the implementation of community education forums;
- 7. Assist in the implementation of Case Coordination Services;
- 8. Provide support for transportation services for youth;
- 9. Maintain accurate and up-to-date documentation;
- 10. Attend required meetings and trainings;
- 11. Provide services on a flexible schedule; and
- 12. Other related duties as assigned by supervisor, or as identified in program manuals or funding source contracts.

Required Education & Training:

- 1. Bachelors Degree in Criminal Justice, Social Work, Education or equivalent experience;
- 2. At least 1 year of related working experience with high-risk, at-risk, probation, foster care, and/or low-income youth and/or parents;
- 3. Experience working with diverse communities;
- 4. Excellent verbal and written communication skills and attention to detail in documentation;
- 5. Computer literate; and
- 6. Must have a valid California driver's license, excellent driving record, and auto insurance.

Preferred Education & Training:

- 1. Bilingual in Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, or Spanish; and,
- 2. Experience with group facilitation, & group presentations or experience with home-visitation & case management.
