

2016 Community Action Leadership Internship Program

Established in 2015, the Community Action Leadership Internship Program is paid, eight-week projects-based program sponsored by C.A.C.A. Los Angeles. It will begin June 13 and end on August 5, 2016. Stipend will be \$800.00 (U.S.) per intern made possible through a grant from C.A.C.A. Los Angeles Community Action. Two interns, called "Summer Associates," will engage hands-on in major projects that further Purposes and Objectives of the nation's oldest civil rights and social advocacy organization for American citizens of Chinese ancestry:

- pursuing the highest ethics, morals, and values,
- practicing and defending American citizenship and American patriotism,
- bettering the economic and political opportunities in our communities,
- preserving historical and cultural traditions, and
- assuring the education of our youth and community.

Interns will gain applicable experience for future involvement with C.A.C.A. or other nonprofit community organizations.

- Assist in the production of the monthly C.A.C.A. Times of Southern California
- Preparation of a monthly members meeting (first Saturday of each month)
- Field trips to offices of elected officials or allied community partners
- A Special Project that Summer Associates must decide jointly at beginning of internship and must complete on or before end of the internship

- Passion for and commitment to civil rights, social justice, community organizing, history and preservation and education for the Asian and Pacific Islander (API) community
- Prior experience in community service is considered: examples are public interest work, civil rights, voter engagement drives and community empowerment advocacy
- A strong ethnic and professional demeanor

DUTIES:

Depending on assignment, duties include, but are not limited, to the following:

- Submit a weekly time sheet outline the tasks performed on a weekly basis
- Write an article for the *C.A.C.A. Times of Southern California*. Topics can range from intern's experience involvement with C.A.C.A., review of an event, or addressing an issue of concern to the membership. Also, assist in the production and assembly of the newsletter for mailing.
- Assist in the preparation and attend a C.A.C.A. Los Angeles Lodge general meeting
- Office duties (i.e., filing, copying, organizing, preparing for events). Light to moderate lifting.
