Human Trafficking Outreach Project

HTOP is a grassroots project designed to raise awareness about human trafficking in Los Angeles County and to help reduce it by educating local businesses about Senate Bill 1193, a law that passed in 2012. Our volunteers educate the businesses about the law as well as provide them with informational posters that they are required to display according to this law—posters that can provide victims of human trafficking with a way out.

The HTOP project trains volunteers to conduct outreach to mandated businesses. Such businesses include bars, urgent care centers, emergency rooms, strip clubs, train, bus, and rail stations, and more. There has been a significant increase in the number of calls to the local hotline since this Project began.

Take a stand against human trafficking and join us as we take to the streets of Los Angeles for a Night of Outreach.
