The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) sponsors the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program to provide free basic tax return preparation for low- to moderate-income taxpayers including military veterans, the elderly, and taxpayers with limited English proficiency or a disability. The California State Controller works with the IRS to make these programs available in communities throughout California.

You do not need to be a tax expert to make a difference...

- ⇒ Receive specialized IRS training
- ⇒ Add a new job skill and volunteer experience to your résumé
- ⇒ Earn Continuing Professional Education (CPE) credits in certain fields
- ⇒ Help stimulate the local economy

As a VITA volunteer, you will work with a local sponsoring organization. Tax sites are generally open from February through April 15, with flexible hours and locations statewide.
